Paris and the Cliché of History Catherine E. Clark, 2018-07-19 This book turns a compelling new lens on thinking about the history of Paris and photography The invention of photography changed how history could be written But the now commonplace assumptions that photographs capture fragments of lost time or present emotional gateways to the past that structure today's understandings did not emerge whole cloth in 1839 Focusing on one of photography's birthplaces Paris and the Cliché of History tells the story of how photographs came to be imagined as documents of the past Author Catherine E Clark analyzes photography's effects on historical interpretation by examining the formation of Paris's first photo archives at the Musée Carnavalet and the city's municipal library their use in illustrated history books and historical exhibitions and reconstructions such as the 1951 celebration of Paris's 2000th birthday and the public's contribution to the historical record in amateur photo contests Despite the photograph's growing importance in these forums it did not simply replace older forms of illustration visual documentation or written text Photos worked in complex and shifting relation to other types of pictures as photographers popular historians and publishers built on the traditions and iconography of painting and engraving in order to both document the past scientifically and objectively and to reconstruct it romantically In doing so they not only influenced how Parisians thought about the city's past and how they pictured it they also ensured that these images shaped how Parisians lived their own lives especially in deeply charged moments such as the Liberation after World War II This history of picturing Paris does not simply reflect the city's history it is Parisian history

Fin de millénaire French Fiction Ruth Cruickshank, 2009-10-08 The turn of the millennium in France coincided with a number of tangible crises and apocalyptic discourses and with the growth of the mass media and global market further generating and manipulating crisis In this original wide ranging but closely analytical study Cruickshank contextualizes and reads the work of four influential writers of prose fiction Angot Echenoz Houellebecq and Redonnet teasing out each one's response to this convergence She suggests that the recurrent fictional and cultural trope of the turning point has both aesthetic and critical potential Bringing together analyses spanning literature thought and culture she identifies and critiques the ways in which on the eve of the twenty first century different theoretical and fictional approaches confront the manipulation of crisis discourses Drawing on a long twentieth century of crisis thinking Cruickshank counters the perception that a postmodern model of perpetual crisis is

A King Seen from the Sky Bruno Gibert, 2015-10-19 This delightful book by award winning children s book author and illustrator Bruno Gibert is inspired by the true story of the first flight of living creatures in a handmade aircraft On September 19 1783 the Montgolfier brothers demonstrated their new invention the hot air balloon or montgolfi re at the Palace of Versailles before a large crowd including Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette Considered too dangerous for human passengers the experimental vessel carried a sheep a duck and a hen in its basket The balloon flew for about eight minutes covered a distance of roughly two miles and reached an altitude of more than 1 500 feet before landing safely The animals balloon ride caused a sensation and the first human flight followed a few months later By the end of 1783 Louis XVI had ennobled the Montgolfier family in recognition of the brothers important achievements which perhaps prompted a royal celebration for the animals like the one depicted in the book In Gibert s fantasy the animals anger the king at the fete by describing him as no bigger than the tiniest snail when viewed from high above the ground and Louis imprisons them in the Bastille While the direct role of talking animals in the storming of the Bastille in 1789 can t quite be supported by historical evidence this book does vividly evoke the stirring developments in aeronautics that took place right around the time of the French Revolution Ages five to seven
