problems other than the motor features of PD Therefore they are often admitted to non neurological wards where the staff is unfamiliar with PD management Among the issues related to hospitalization in patients with PD drug related problems such as inappropriate levodopa timing of administration the use of contraindicated centrally acting antidopaminergic drugs and anticholinergic burden remain among the most troublesome
