The book examines the political dimension at a level which has hitherto been absent from accounts of Third Ypres. Prior and Wilson consider the shifting ambitions and stratagems of the high command examine the logistics of war and assess what the available manpower weaponry technology and intelligence could realistically have hoped to achieve. And most powerfully of all they explore the experience of the soldiers in the light of whether they knew it or not of what would never be accomplished.
