Strategy Partners can help one other read in a smooth voice. When you meet in partner time, put one book between the two of you. Look at the words, listen to yourself, and listen to your partner. Try to read in one voice, passing at the same places and using the same expression.

Teaching Tip One way to get children to prompt each other in partnerships is to become a "ghost partner." Whisper into children's ears a phrase or sentence starter that you want them to repeat to their partner. In no time at all, they will start taking up the language as their own. So, for this strategy you might whisper, "Left try that again" or "That sounded choppy, right?" or "Should we try that one more time?" for them to literally repeat to their partner.
